1	Consiglio Nazionale Dei Giovani	Name: Maria Cristina Rosaria Pisani Title: President	<p>The Italian Youth Council (Consiglio Nazionale dei Giovani – CNG) is a national advisory body established by the 2019 Budget Law (Law of 30 December 2018, No. 145) with the aim of providing strategic advice to Italian institutions on policies concerning young people. The CNG works towards promoting youth active citizenship, supporting youth associations through the exchange of good practices and creating youth networks, and facilitating the creation and development of local youth consultative bodies.</p> <p>The Council collaborates with public administrations and conducts studies and prepares reports on the condition of young people for the development of youth policies. The CNG expresses opinions and makes proposals on legislative proposals affecting young people and participates in European and international forums to encourage communication, relations, and exchanges between youth organisations in different countries.</p> <p>The Council can be heard by the President of the Council of Ministers or delegated political authority on matters and policies that impact youth. The CNG promotes and supports projects of interest to young people and fosters interactions between youth organisations by supporting their common projects, in line with the fundamental aims and principles of the Council. 20	French Network of Urban Planning Agencies - French Partnership for Cities and Territories	<p>Name: Brigitte Bariol Mathais</p> <p>Title: General Delegate</p>	<p>The French Network of Urban Planning Agencies (FNAU) is a federation of 50 urban planning agencies that promotes the exchange of experiences, the organisation of events, and collective projects. FNAU works closely with local authority associations, ministries, and network leaders at the national and international level to promote the "urban planning agency" model and contribute to debates on cities and territories. The main objective of FNAU is to support the territorial development of cities and territories by encouraging innovation and sharing of best practices among its members.</p> <p>Apart from promoting the urban planning agency model, FNAU coordinates the French Partnership for Cities and Territories (PFVT), which is a multi-stakeholder platform aiming to contribute to the New Urban Agenda and the UN-Habitat flagship program "people-focused smart cities." Through this partnership, FNAU facilitates the sharing of knowledge and expertise among its members and other stakeholders to promote sustainable urban development. The federation also supports research and innovation in urban planning and advocates for policies that support the development of sustainable cities and territories.</p> <p>In addition to its regular activities, FNAU organises various events and projects to promote sustainable urban development and innovation. These include seminars, conferences, workshops, and exhibitions that bring together stakeholders from different sectors to share ideas and experiences.
