

THE WORLD URBAN FORUM Proposed Expected Accomplishments

- EA 1 **Awareness is raised** on sustainable urbanization among stakeholders and constituencies, including the general public;
- EA 2- **Collective knowledge** on sustainable urban development is improved through inclusive open debates, sharing of lessons learned and the exchange of urban solutions, good practices and policies;
- EA 3 **Coordination and cooperation** is increased within the UN system and with different stakeholders and constituencies for an effective implementation of the New Urban Agenda;
- EA 4 **Substantive and strategic inputs from multilateral organizations**, national and subnational governments and stakeholders, are provided into the reporting of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda (aligned with Op. 167 of the New Urban Agenda)
- EA 5 **UN-Habitat profile is raised and corporate effectiveness** improved, with specific focus on implementing and subsequently feed the 6 years Strategic Plan and biennial Work Programme and Budget

WUF9 High-level roundtables

Goals

- Raise the profile of the role of the New Urban Agenda in achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.
- Mobilize support from national and subnational governments, as well as other organizations, in implementing sustainable urban development.
- Unfold key paradigm shifts introduced by the New Urban Agenda for an effective implementation.

Structure

- Two co-chairs at the level of heads of state and/or ministers
- Three hours
- Focus on inclusion, innovative policies and urban solutions, partnerships, resource mobilization, measurements and data.





WUF9 Six High-level roundtables

- 1. Cities for All and housing at the center
- 2. The urban role in the climate change action
- 3. An integrated territorial approach to sustainable development
- 4. Innovative governance for open and inclusive cities
- 5. Urbanization and Development: investing in the transformative force of cities
- 6. Sustainable urban development for peace and security

Based on the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals, conclusions of the Habitat III High-Level roundtables, implementation of the New Urban Agenda and current United Nations reform.







WUF9 Dialogues

Goals

- Focus and debate on policy recommendations and actions in the implementation of the New Urban Agenda.
- Collect inputs on the key action areas.
- Promote pre-WUF and post-WUF participation on these topics.
- Demonstrate UN-Habitat capacity on mobilizing partners.

Structure

- Duration of 2 hours
- Introduction from UN-Habitat on the topic
- Presentation from invited speakers
- Open debate with the audience and way forward

Based on the UN-Habitat Action Framework for the Implementation of the New Urban Agenda (AFINUA). Convened by UN-Habitat and key partners.

Focus on innovations introduced since 2015, existing and new partnerships, tools and indicators, urban solutions and inclusive approaches to age and gender responsiveness and human rights mainstreaming.





WUF9 Special Sessions

Goals

- Collect inputs on the implementation of the New Urban Agenda from the United Nations system.
- Demonstrate lead role of UN-Habitat within the United Nations system.
- Raise the profile for UN-Habitat technical expertise for strategic delivery of the New Urban Agenda.

Structure

- Duration of 2 hours
- Convened by UN-Habitat in collaboration with the United Nations system
- Focus on result based and action oriented discussions addressing questions on inclusivity, innovation, integration, partnerships, resource mobilization, measurements and data.

Listen to Cities room

- Unique space for subnational governments.
- Provide a platform for interaction between national and subnational authorities.



WUF9 Events - Deadline 24 November 2017

Networking events

Networking events have a duration of two hours long and should focus on strengthening partnerships, calling for new alliances or launching joint initiatives on the implementation of the New Urban Agenda.

Side events

Side events are one hour long and should focus on concrete examples of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda such as projects, research, data, etc.

Training Events

Training events should focus on developing skills and knowledge of the WUF9 participants and targeted audiences, by providing "how to" approach to development challenges with innovative tools, methodologies and instruments to support the implementation of the New Urban Agenda.

Exhibition

It is designed to provide space to countries and city programs, for showcasing services, products, and innovative urban solutions.







WUF9 Letters of Invitation

The first letter from UN-Habitat Executive Director to the Ministers of Foreign Affairs was sent in September.

The second letter from UN-Habitat Executive Director and the Minister of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government of Malaysia to the line ministers has been sent in the last days. Letters of invitation being sent to mayors, intergovernmental organizations, other United Nations agencies and stakeholders.

WUF9 Least Developed Countries participation

Two representatives of each LDC invited to the WUF9 in Kuala Lumpur. Deadline to confirm participation: 15 November 2017. After receiving confirmation, information on the process for applying would be sent.





WUF9 Volunteers

Liaison officers

A total of 160 liaison officers. Interviewed and short-listed by the Institute of Diplomacy and Foreign Relations of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Malaysia. Workshops started on 23 October 2017.

Volunteers

A total of 530 volunteers including professionals and students. Capacity building to start in the next days.







WUF9 Special initiatives

Technical visits

There will be a total of eight zones of technical visits showcasing urban solutions in Malaysia. Aspects showcased will be urban housing, community development, urban heritage, urban innovation and urban transformation.

WUF9 Urban Village - Medan Pasar

First street level showcase implementing the New Urban Agenda creating a unique public space to the city. A legacy city regeneration development presenting pioneer and innovative solutions discussed and agreed with the community.

Green mobility

The venues will be well connected through a network of pedestrian walkways which are safe, clearly demarcated and convenient for use. The bike rental scheme will have 1,500 bicycles from various locations across the city.

BIKE4U Project

Major legacy to the city with 11 kilometers in total to support low carbon city and to make KL a cyclable city.
