- Meetings with all subprogrammes and regional offices to elaborate the WUF9 logical framework based on a medium-long strategy and linkages with other subprogrammes and regional offices
- Discussions on the logframes from September to December 2017
- Creation of "priority tracks" and a "matrix" per each track

SUBPROGRAMME 1 URBAN LAND, LEGISLATION AND GOVERNANCE







Expected Accomplishment (based on WP&B 18-19)

- Increased capacity of local and national governments and other partners to implement urban legislation in the areas of urban extension, densification, urban planning and finance
- Increased capacity of partner local and national governments and other partners to implement programmes that improve security of tenure for all, including for vulnerable groups, women, young people and indigenous people
- Increased capacity of partner local and national governments and other partners to develop and adopt or adapt policies, plans and strategies that strengthen decentralized governance and inclusive urban management and safety

- Capacity-building on sustainable urban energy

- Improved slum upgrading and prevention policies, strategies or programmes

- Improved coordination and mainstreaming of the cross-cutting issues across all UN-Habitat's programs and Field Projects

- Innovative and Affordable Financing Mechanism for achieving Affordable Housing for All thus upscaling slum upgrading at City Wide
- Events for ACP countries engaging and implementing Slum Upgrading Programmes
- Capacity development on Participatory Slum Upgrading, Financing Strategies for Slum Upgrading and the "Affordable Housing Studio"
- Awareness on human rights in cities in alignment with the New Urban Agenda
- Promotion of the SHERPA building rating tool
- Promote dialogue on Migration in Cities







- Financial and political support from key partner countries for mainstreaming Housing at the Centre
- Partners mobilized and partnerships built to address the global challenge of housing affordability following the Housing at the Centre approach
- Political and financial commitment of ACP/EC for PSUP upscaling
- Knowledge and best practices exchange on developing financing to fit the purpose of pro-poor development (slum upgrading and affordable housing) disseminated

- Support to response for resilience recovery in urban crises, with a particular focus on the poor and vulnerable groups
