#### Responding to the immediate needs of shelter, water, sanitation and hygiene in Al-Hudaydah, Yemen

- 125 homes in Qataba, Yemen were renovated after being completely destructed by war.
- Community members were trained on building and constructions skills and employed through the cash for work initiative.







Riverbank Filtration technology to support clean water provision to vulnerable populations in Egypt

- Cost-efficient, can be built rapidly, and is an environmentally friendly process which relies on natural soil filtration to treat the water, producing clean and potable water that is approved by the Egyptian Ministry of Health and Population.
- Over 450,000 from vulnerable populations in three different governorates in Assiut, Sohag and Luxor, in Upper Egypt will benefit from the intervention







### Rebuilding of public buildings, facilities and Housing in returnee sites in Darfur

- As of March 2020, UN-Habitat has constructed 81 public facilities including six schools, 44 health facilities and six rural courts in 59 villages in five Darfur States. These were all built in cooperation with the Government of Sudan, and have improved the lives of close to six million people.
- By opening day of Sunta Girls' School 94 students were already enrolled for the year. This doubles the number of female students in the community.



UN-Habitat response is aligned to United Nations system collaboration mechanisms at country, regional and global levels. To maximize our outreach and impact we work with local government associations, local governments, and civil society organizations including grassroots organizations. We empower communities and their leaders to maximize the ownership success and impact of response programmes.



#### **Support to Arab States**

Current requirements for the region amount to **USD 24.8 million** for **10** countries. The support for each country is summarized in the next slides.

#### **Priority Areas**



Mapping and spatial analysis of hotspots to shape local responses, reorganize informal markets, transport hubs, plan public spaces and buildings for health and emergency services



Local governments and grassroots organizations need to work together to find **integrated community driven solutions** in informal settlements cope with the scale of the problem



Designing strategies to mitigate the economic impact on of COVID-19 on local governments, small business and informal laborers who make up the bulk of the workforce in cities in many developing countries



Providing fast-track learning for cities and communities, particularly in informal settlements, to help them to respond to new daily challenges from COVID-19



Affordable water and sanitation facilities are central to controlling the outbreak in informal settlements



Self-isolation is difficult in overcrowded informal settlements. Housing options and security of tenure in informal settlements is a priority during this crisis



Supporting local governments to manage urban mobility and transport to keep it safe while observing movement restrictions

Supporting the functioning of food supply chains and creating labour-intensive jobs in the agricultural sector to mitigate COVID-19 impact on economy

- The rehabilitation of the 4.3 km long tertiary 'Irrigation Canal EC-9'
- The canal serves around 18,000 acres of agriculture land
- Rehabilitation will contribute to a more equitable distribution of water quotas among landholders, allowing nearby farmers to increase the yield of their fields and orchards and improve their economic conditions.





#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM ONGROUND WORK - COVID19 RESPONSE



# Equipping vulnerable urban populations including refugees and migrants with WaSH facilities to mitigate the impact of COVID-19

- Handwashing facilities placed in hotspots to serve vulnerable communities
- Awareness raising plan developed to accompany implementation and awareness material posted on HWS to raise community awareness on COVID-19 protection





#### b) Country Level:



#### Covid-19 response in high-risk urban areas and densely populated settlements

- 25 solid waste containers were distributed in Homs city to ensure mitigation of the spread of Covid-19 in highrisk and underserviced residential areas and public spaces.
- 35 workers have been deployed at Al-Fayhaa neighborhood to collect daily household waste for two months, the workers were provided with equipment and PPEs to ensure effective decontamination measures, and personal protection from infection.
- visibility materials are being prepared for the Hygiene Awareness campaign planned for July.





#### b) Country Level: UN COVID-19 Response and Recovery Multi-Partner Trust Fund



Strengthening social protection and economic relief systems for vulnerable and marginalized segments of the population as a response to COVID-19

- A three-pronged COVID-19 approach:
- 1. Support the Government of Tunisia to target and include the vulnerable communities in national response.
- 2. Provide emergency support financial, psychological, shelter, NFI, etc. to excluded communities to leave no one behind.
- Provide sustainable economic generating opportunities to marginalized women, supporting small and micro businesses, and promoting their inclusion in the digital economy.

UN-Habitat will provide policy support and quick operational solutions to address forced evictions and improve the protection of the homeless



















#### b) Country Level: Egypt Informal Markets Guide

- A guideline on COVID-19 response mechanisms to mitigate its spread and employ prevention schemes in informal settlements and markets.
- Based on the Global Humanitarian Response Plan, the UN-Habitat COVID-19 Response Strategy and ROAS Urban Response Framework to COVID-19.
- Presented to both the Ministry of Local Development (MOLD) and the Informal Settlements Development Fund (ISDF) in Egypt,
- The guideline will be disseminated by MOLD to all local authorities for implementation
