Resolution 1/4 on gender equality

Scope of the resolution

- 1) Two-fold gender strategy:
 - a) Mainstreaming gender equality and women's empowerment into UN-Habitat's normative and operational work
 - b) Setting policies and programmes towards achieving gender equality and women's empowerment
- 2) Partnerships
- 3) Engagement with Advisory Group on Gender Issues (AGGI)
- 4) Revised Gender Policy and Plan (2020 2023)



Resolution 1/4 on gender equality

- Use of Project Review Committee to strengthen Leaving No One Behind (gender, social inclusion)
- UN-Habitat Policy and Plan for Gender Equality and other guiding documents under review
- UN-Habitat Evaluation of gender equality and the empowerment of women (2014–2019), using also Advisory Group on Gender Issues.
- Focus on strategic partnerships on gender, human rights and other social inclusion issues (ex. UN Women, UNAIDS, OHCHR)



Resolution 1/5 on enhancing urban-rural linkages for sustainable urbanization and human settlements

Scope of the Resolution





PROGRESS REPORT

Decision 1/3 on arrangements for the transition towards the new governance structure of UN-Habitat – Stakeholder engagement policy





Further decides, on an exceptional basis, to entrust the Executive Board with continuing discussions on, and completing as soon as possible, the development of a **UN-Habitat stakeholder engagement policy**, as requested by the Governing Council in its resolution 26/7, with a view to its provisional implementation on the basis of consensus, and to submit the draft policy for consideration and possible approval by the United Nations Habitat Assembly at its second session.



Progress on Decision 1/3 on Transition Arrangements – Stakeholder Engagement Policy

- At the Executive Board Meeting of 29 June 2020, the Chair of the Ad-hoc Working Group on the Stakeholder Engagement Policy recommended that the group continue with its work only when possible to have physical meetings. Due to the nature of the issues under discussion by the group, it was noted that these matters would require in-person negotiations.
- On 10 September 2020 the Bureau appointed a new Chair of the working group, Pakistan and a Co-Chair, Malawi following the departure of the previous Chair.
- The new Chair and co-Chair will provide guidance on when the next meeting of the Ad-hoc working group on Stakeholder Engagement Policy will be held to primarily consider organizational matters.
