SG's Policy Brief on COVID-19 in an Urban World

- Coordination in the UN System contributed to greater visibility of the specific challenges of the COVID-19 response in human settlements and cities
- Sets the scope and priorities for UN-Habitat's engagement and a framework for leveraging system-wide action with diverse partners. UN-Habitat will focus on:
 - a. Developing further the health and development nexus
 - b. Considering health, governance and urban finance nexus
 - c. Understanding how urban planning and infrastructure can enhance urban resilience
 - d. Understanding long-term implications of pandemics for UN-Habitat's work
 - e. Considering socio-economic impacts and the links with urban finance
 - f. Investing in basic services, housing and slum upgrading.



In 2021, the COVID response will shift to adapted city- and country-specific support:

- a. Increased focus on policies and actions to mitigate the local social and economic impact of COVID-19, working with a coalition of global thought leaders and stakeholders in public and private spheres
- b. Extra effort to engage through United Nations Country Teams (UNCTs), supporting the review and elaboration of socio-economic analysis of the COVID-19 impact and related response plans
- c. Actively supporting the elaboration of Common Country Analysis (CCAs), and Cooperation Frameworks (CFs) building also on the Secretary-General Policy Brief



The continued support to COVID-19 response and recovery will take forward the recommendations and analysis contained in UN-Habitat's report **"Cities and Pandemics: Towards a more just, green and healthy future.**"

The report provides normative and urban policy guidance on the impacts of COVID-19 and the future city responses in four inter-connected areas:

- a. Poverty and inequality
- b. Form and the function of the city
- c. Normative and governance mechanisms
- d. Urban economy systems



Deactivation of Level 3 Emergency protocols for COVID-19 Pandemic

- 23 January 2021 deactivation of the system-wide COVID-tailored IASC Scale-Up protocols
- 01 March 2021 UN-Habitat suspended the Level 3 emergency protocols for COVID-19 response
- UN-Habitat reverts to its standard procedures for programming and crisis response as defined in the established structure
- Past year experience will inform UN-Habitat's collective learning and knowledge to support responses to future urban crises



Opportunities for Member States to support UN-Habitat's response to COVID

- Strategic use of and policy references to the recommendations in "Cities and Pandemics: Towards a more just, green and healthy future"
- Investment in core funding to allow flexibility of resources when new needs arise and life-saving support needed; support for an emergency fund for UN-Habitat Executive Director's deployment in line with existing protocols.
- Strengthen strategic partnerships and resources for data and analysis, particularly at granular level and for global aggregation
- Support for the Executive Director's priorities, mainstreaming COVID response, prevention and recovery
 - Adequate, accessible and affording housing (including basic services): underfunded area of UN-Habitat's work and vital to COVID response
 - Adaptation and resilience: strengthening community and city capacity to withstand future shocks
 - Localisation of SDGs: empowering human settlements in an integrated approach
