LOCATION: COLOMBIA | SPAN: SCHOOL YEAR | TARGET AUDIENCE: PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS

OBJECTIVE:

To raise awareness among the entire school community about the importance of individual and collective responsibility towards waste management, as well as to reduce the amount of waste generated at school.

INITIATIVE SUMMARY (WHAT & HOW):

The education strategy adopted by the school Los Nogales aims at raising awareness on waste management and engaging students of all ages through transdisciplinary activities and close monitoring of waste generation and practices. The three focus areas of waste education are; reducing food waste and introducing composting; reducing non-organic waste consumption such as single use plastic; and collecting recyclables including e-waste. Also, per a school's strategy, a culture to reuse school uniforms has been introduced together with a book rental system. Moreover, to visualise the school's efforts, data collection at school was started which quantifies the water footprint and the money wasted.



Impact: Improved organic waste management, Improved segregation and recycling of school waste, Reduced waste generation



Resources: School staff, Designated budget for initiatives, Composting facility, Waste-o-meter
