

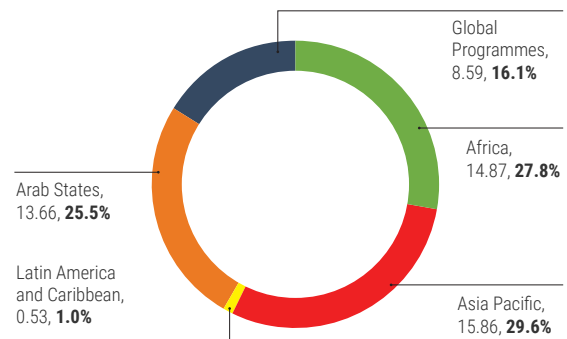

2021 earmarked income allocation by UN-Habitat implementing region in USD millions



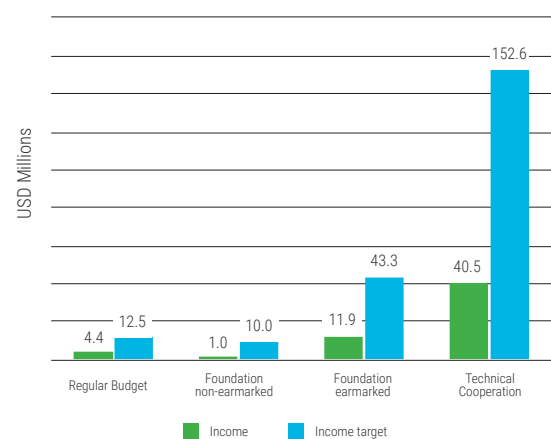

Strengthening resilience against natural disasters for urban communities in Afghanistan

"We knew our main school building was vulnerable to earthquakes and the canal next to the school was the source of illnesses for the children and the staff.... Our children can now study at school well and safe." a community leader speaking about the Amir Dost Mohammed Khan School in Kabul.

Afghanistan's cities and towns are extremely vulnerable to disasters such as floods, landslides and drought which have become worse due to climate change. Without proper drainage and flood canals, many urban residents suffer from flash floods every year. The north and north-east region, on the fringe of Pamir and Himalayan ranges, is particularly prone to earthquakes where even small to moderate earthquakes can result in extensive damage to houses because there is a lack of building standards, proper building techniques and appropriate skills. Rehabilitation and reconstruction after disasters is further undermined by the prolonged conflict in the country.

To respond to these problems, the **City Resilience** project (2017-2019) was undertaken, with support of USD 3.3 million from the government of Japan, to strengthen the resilience of urban communities against disasters in the capital Kabul and the third largest city of Mazar-i-Sharif in the north. It took an inclusive approach, consulting widely with urban communities to assess possible hazards and risks, and identify actions to address vulnerabilities.

As a result, communities were able to construct 4.5 km of flood canals in Kabul and 3.2 km in Mazar-i-Sharif, which increased the resilience of around 100 vulnerable houses against earthquakes in those cities. Meanwhile, five Safe-School programmes succeeded in rebuilding vulnerable school buildings and carried out risk reduction classes and school disaster drills which included first aid training for teachers and community members. Thanks to the project, the direct beneficiaries, some 48,000 vulnerable citizens in the two cities, are now free from the floods during the rainy season, and their houses and schools will be safe from future earthquakes.

For sustainability, UN-Habitat supported the Government in drafting its National Disaster Risk Reduction Strategy and provided training to government staff working with United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction.

Property registration drive in Somalia to increase local government revenues for better services

"The property registration, using Geographic Information System will not only ease and increase property tax collections but will also enhance transparency and accountability in the revenue collection process," said Ali Abdi Adem, the Director General at Baidoa's Ministry of Finance of South-West State.

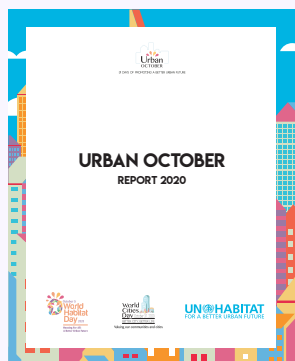
In Somalia, several states want to increase domestic revenue sources to add to insufficient budgets for delivering better services. Local people have expressed their willingness to pay taxes and for municipal authorities to invest in social services to foster collaboration between public authorities and local communities.

In Baidoa district in South-West State, more than 21,400 properties were mapped and registered through a project of the UN-Habitat Joint Programme on Local Governance working with government partners and other stakeholders. The registration of properties, concluded in February 2021, involved establishing sub-zones boundaries, updating district administrative maps, classifying and naming of roads, and installation of road signs. These actions are expected to generate an estimated USD \$500,000 per year in untapped revenue streams in Baidoa.

The property registration in Baidoa comes alongside two other initiatives aimed at supporting local and state authorities to tackle displacement in Somalia's South-West State. More than 55,000 households of displaced communities in 483 sites around the former agricultural center of Baidoa were counted in 2020. Under the UN Peacebuilding Fund supported Midnimo (Unity) project, implemented by UN-Habitat and the International Organization for Migration (IOM), a 3.3km trail was upgraded to an access road connecting the urban centre of Baidoa with the new Barwaaqo IDP resettlement site that provides secure tenure for over 2,000 households already. The new road also allows access to a planned city extension area for more than 50,000 inhabitants.

UN-Habitat together with IOM, UNDP and the Resident Coordinator's Office have developed an upscaling project for durable solutions using UN-Habitat's Social Tenure Security Model and targeting over 25,000 IDPs and host community members directly. With support from the Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (Sida), detailed area planning has started for an urban regeneration project in Baidoa's second largest cluster of IDP sites. The project aims to foster local reintegration and social cohesion with hosting communities by engaging strongly with youth and other local action groups.

Urban October Report 2020



UN-Habitat has just published its comprehensive [report](#) on Urban October 2020 which saw a record breaking 753 events in 74 countries and 230 cities registered on the UN-Habitat website covering all aspects of Sustainable Urbanization. This included 540 events in the Americas, 75 in Europe, 62 in Africa, 54 in Asia and 5 in Oceania. World Habitat Day, which took place on 5 October 2020 with the theme *Housing for All: A Better Urban Future* featured 69 events in 42 countries and 59 cities with the Global Observance in Surabaya, Indonesia. World Cities Day (WCD) was on 31 October under the sub theme *Valuing our communities and cities* with 77 events in 39 countries and 70 cities. The first Global Observance of World Cities Day in Africa was hosted by Nakuru in Kenya.
