Annual Report 2020



to address urban poverty and inequality, improve access to basic services, strengthen climate action in cities, respond to urban crises and improve resilience of cities to future shocks. With cities at the forefront in tackling the Covid-19 crisis, supporting the response was a major priority for UN-Habitat in 2020. Other achievements include new innovative financing mechanisms to attract investment in urban initiatives including multi-donor funding to UN-Habitat's **flagship programmes**. UN-Habitat also produced new urban data and knowledge some of which is featured in its World's Cities Report 2020 and Report on Cities and Pandemics. The annual report highlights UN-Habitat's catalytic role, working with strategic partners to provide the services outlined in the agency's 2020 Catalogue of Services, and to co-create innovative urban solutions and advocate for sustainable urbanization through the World Urban Forum, World Urban Campaign, and Urban October. The report confirms that UN-Habitat's strategic plan remains robust, flexible and relevant in a changing global environment. The report recommends greater alignment of action plans with secured funding, further strengthening the organization's catalytic role, and customizing responses to local, country and regional contexts.

Urban areas have been at the forefront of the COVID-19 crisis, with 95 per cent of all cases recorded in cities in the first months. This report shows how compact, well planned cities which combine residential and commercial functions with public spaces and affordable housing can improve public health, local economy and the environment, and help address the huge challenges faced by cities as a result of the pandemic. It gives guidance on how cities can reduce the impact of future pandemics and become more prosperous, fair and

sustainable recovery including rethinking the layout and design of urban areas for compact cities with public spaces, nearby services, clinics and schools. Four priorities are highlighted: Rethinking the form and function of the city; addressing systemic poverty and inequality in cities; rebuilding a 'New Normal' urban economy; and clarifying urban legislation and governance arrangements. 

CIF engages city authorities, investors and other stakeholders through the Cities Investment Portal (CIP) where project proposals can be entered online, a Cities Investment Advisory Platform (CIAP) where proposals are assessed by an Urban Lab on their alignment with the SDGs and their financial feasibility, and finally, through the Cities Investment Vehicles (CI Vehicles), successful proposals are presented to potential investors. Three of the nine proposals presented through this process at WUF10 are now close to finalising investment deals. Investors so far include the Green Climate Fund and Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank. Experience with the CIF has highlighted the need for support for development of viable proposals that are attractive to investors. UN-Habitat is, therefore, establishing **feasibility fund** to finance feasibility studies as well as due diligence work to de-risk and develop viable proposals that can attract and leverage large investments from private and public entities, and in the long term, realise good return on investments while delivering sustainable and high impact urban development results. The fund, under discussion by UN-Habitat's Foundations and

Philanthropy Platform's innovative financing working stream, has attracted a lot of interest and possible seed capital of around USD 500,000;

it is an important element of UN-Habitat's strategy to diversify sources of funding and financing for sustainable urbanization.





This includes reconstruction of bridges, rehabilitation of mangrove and construction of safe-havens, among others. The work will be carried out through Oxfam as the main implementing partner in the four cities of Zomba (Malawi), Morondava (Madagascar), Chokwe (Mozambique), and Moroni (Union of Comoros) and will be concluded by 2024. The interventions were identified as priority actions in the four cities by CityRAP, a UN-Habitat's participatory resilience planning tool.

The blue economy relies on natural resources from marine and coastal ecosystems. In March 2021, Team Europe together with Kenya's Governors of the six coastal counties, the Ministry of Devolution and the Blue Economy Secretariat, launched the Go Blue initiative in Kenya which has an abundance of untapped maritime resources along its coast. Thanks to support of EUR 25 million from the European Union and its member states, the initiative will harness important coastal and marine resources to achieve a sustainable blue economy and bring jobs to over 3,000 youth and women. Initiatives under programme will include small-scale fisheries, waste recycling, aquaculture or tourism, and entrepreneurial and technical skills in blue economy sectors to strengthen value chains and tackle regional bottlenecks. Go Blue will be implemented with Jumuiya ya Kaunti za Pwani, Kenya's coast regional counties Economic Development Organization together and national government departments and ministries including the Blue Economy Secretariat, Kenya Coast Guard Service, Bandari Maritime Academy, and Ministries of Agriculture and Fisheries; Interior; and Transport. The four EU Member States France, Germany, Italy, and Portugal are providing their expertise to foster economic growth, while the two UN agencies UN-Habitat and UNEP will ensure that interventions are in line with obligations of environmental conservation and urban planning, and adapt and mitigate coastal cities while communities will help protect against the adverse effects of climate change.

The appointment was announced on the International Day of Sport for Development and Peace, which recognizes the role sport and physical activity play in communities and in people's lives across the world. This follows an agreement between UN-Habitat and the Tremplins Blaise Matuidi foundation to wok together to promote equal access to decent housing and basic services including schools, recreation, water, sanitation, health and public spaces, for children and families living in informal settlements in Central Africa. His role will help raise awareness and

mobilize support from partners including governments, the private sector and civil society for projects to improve social and sports facilities in informal

settlements Angola, Cameroon, Congo Brazzaville, Central African Republic, the Democratic Republic of Congo and São Tomé and Principe.

The Afghanistan Urban Safety and Security Program (AUSSP) promotes safe, secure, and inclusive cities, working in eight strategic cities of Afghanistan. The programme has reached over four million people

Afghanistan's Urban Safety and Security reaches four million

across eight major cities and established approaches to make Afghanistan cities safer, accountable, and more productive. Over 370,000 people have benefited from the programme which has helped communities to implement 110 prioritized safety projects. Bringing women to the forefront of development works in Afghanistan has been a tremendous challenge for many decades. More than half of the implementers were women; the programme involved over 2,000 women directly in the urban development processes, community policing, and safety projects implementation. More than 80 municipal and urban governance officers, including culture and gender specialists from 52 municipalities across 33 Afghanistan provinces, took part in a workshop to share experiences, lessons learned and best practices on urban governance, safety, and security in Afghanistan cities. "The capacity development sessions improved our knowledge, we have become strategized in our role in the implementation of the sustainable development ..." said Ms. Nasrin, a female participant from Herat municipality.

Cagayan de Oro City in the Philippines became the first city in the world to successfully complete a Waste Wise Cities Tool (WaCT) assessment on their own under UN-Habitat Philippines' Healthy Oceans and Clean Cities Initiative funded by the Government of Japan.




