

RISE-UP: Resilient Settlements for the Urban Poor

Leveraging large-scale investment to build urban adaptation and climate resilience in global hotspots of vulnerability and addressing issues of spatial inequality

- Pro-poor climate resilience mainstreamed in global, national, and local climate strategies and policies & finance architecture with clear recognition of fundamental rights
- Increased investment and financing to inclusive pro-poor and non-discriminatory adaptation projects in global vulnerability hotspots
 - Enhanced capacity among all levels of government and core partners to effectively coordinate action towards building the resilience of the urban poor



In Afghanistan, over 18,000 households (24 per cent female-headed) were registered and benefited from improved tenure security through formal land registrations

FLAGSHIP PROGRAMME Inclusive Cities – Enhancing the Positive Impact of Urban Migration

Supporting local and national authorities to create inclusive and non-discriminatory urban environments for all people

Strengthened urban and territorial systems to respond to rapid population movements, enabling social, cultural and economic development and migrants' inclusion in cities and reducing root causes of migration and displacement

Strengthened capacity of local authorities, benefitting both host and migrant communities and strengthened social cohesion between host and migrant communities.



An integrated approach in 1,000 cities:

- evidence-based policymaking
- digitized tools
- digital capacity support
- technical backstopping
- matchmaking finances with catalytic projects that are aligned with the SDGs.

FLAGSHIP PROGRAMME SDG Cities


The data track: VLRs and the Urban Monitoring Framework bring together data to monitor implementation of the SDGs and identify priorities.

The capacity development track: Diagnostic tools such as the SDGs' Project Assessment Tool directs cities to relevant training programmes and technical resources.

The investment track: A city investment facility supports upstream project design to ensure projects' alignment with SDGs, financial feasibility and match to financing sources.




