• South-east Africa Urban Resilienceproject (Adaptation Fund) building in Madagascar, Malawi, Mozambique and Comoros

In the cities: city-wide early warning systems, improved solid waste management, enhanced drainage capacity, resilient infrastructure, multipurpose safe havens and evacuation centres, reforestation and mangrove rehabilitation, and community managed rainwater harvesting

• CityRAP expansion in 2022: Sahel (7 cities), Comoros (2 cities), Guinea-Bissau (5 cities), Mauritius, and Mozambique (4 cities).

Sampling What We Are Doing: Resilience to Conflict

Land Based Finance for Service Delivery, Reconstruction, Citizenship Building and Sustaining Peace In Fragile States: Scaling up, institutionalizing and replicating good practices

Midnimo (Unity) to enhance local leadership capacities to facilitate the sustainable return, recovery, social integration and peaceful co-existence of displacement affected, returnee, other migrant groups and host communities

Youth Political Empowerment: enabling Somali young women and men to meaningfully engage in governance, peacebuilding and reconciliation efforts

Dhulka Nabaada (The Land of Peace): in Somalia

Supporting Land Reform initiatives and integration of land dispute resolution mechanisms

Joint Programme on Local Governance and Decentralized Service Delivery contributing to peace and stability by effectively and accountably responding to the needs and rights of all Somalis.



What can be expected from ROAf:

- Scale-up and expand existing tools and initiatives e.g CityRAP, EbA tool
- Facilitate city-to-city learning and collaboration to promote urban resilience and NbS best practices across Africa
- Enhance the capacity of municipalities of secondary cities in Africa to access climate finance to support the localisation of the SDGs
- Intensify work on **disaster preparedness** and **urban disaster risk reduction** in Southern Africa (SADC) with use of incoming funds
- Engage further with **NbS and EbA** to build the resilience of informal settlements and replicate best practices in more cities across the region
- Contribute to the expanding body of knowledge on **climate migration** in Africa and **facilitate a dialogue** with relevant stakeholders on the topic across **local**, **national and regional levels**
- Scale-up solutions to displacement
- Intensify work on own resource generation by local government to improve service delivery
