Multi-level governance

Current NDCs are not enough to respond to the climate emergency.

Finance

Local capacity

 The scale and complexity of the challenges and insufficient finance limit the local capacity to tackle climate change.

• In 2017 and 2018, less than 10% of the climate

**finance** needed for cities was reached.

Access to technology and innovation

 Greenhouse gas emissions in cities could be reduced by almost 90% by 2050 with technically feasible and available measures.

Equity

• Urban vulnerable groups are disproportionately and adversely affected by climate change while they contribute the least to urban emissions.
