WHAT is Habitat UNI

UN-Habitat University Network Initiative (Habitat UNI) is UN-Habitat's global partnership with universities. The initiative began in 2008 with the vision for partner universities and individual members to support the normative and operational work of UN-Habitat through research, education and capacity building.

UNI's mission is to:

- Promote cooperation between UN-Habitat and universities and facilitates exchange and collaboration among universities globally
- Enables universities to become closer partners of cities, actively engaged in problem solving
- Aim to close the gap between academia and practice encouraging collaborative learning
- Aspire to create the next generation of urban leaders, managers, researchers and practitioners

WHY Habitat UNI?

UN-Habitat in its <u>Capacity Building Strategy</u> approved by Member States in 2020 acknowledges the need for an expanded, closer, and coordinated collaboration with academic entities worldwide to tap into their knowledge, expertise, and experience.

Academic entities are crucial in training and preparing the next generation of urban professionals, are laboratories for innovative approaches in education and knowledge creation, and have a strong grasp on evidence-based knowledge such as through research with the potential to trigger policy changes. They are pivotal in the effective implementation of the urban dimension of the Sustainable Development Goals.

UN-Habitat aims to strengthen its partnership with universities through Habitat UNI by providing a space for academic stakeholders to discuss the latest urban trends that could impact the transformation of cities, identify and bridge the gap between theoretical and practical knowledge, inform decisions made by UN-Habitat and create collaborative pathways to multiply the dissemination of knowledge, relevant tools, and instruments including through effective North/South South/South cooperation.
