NOTIFICATION FOR THE SECOND SESSION OF THE UN-HABITAT ASSEMBLY.





Notification for the second session of the Assembly was shared on 31 December 2022 in all UN official languages

The Notification contained the **dates** and the **provisional Agenda** for the session. It also contained the **theme** of the session and other **preliminary information**.



THEME OF THE SECOND SESSION OF THE UN-HABITAT ASSEMBLY.





The theme of the second session of the UN-Habitat Assembly is

"A sustainable urban future through inclusive and effective multilateralism: Achieving the SDGs in times of global crises"



EXPECTED STRUCTURE OF THE SECOND SESSION OF THE UN-HABITAT





Member States are encouraged to participate fully in the five-day session.
Detailed discussions are expected under each item of the provisional Agenda
☐ High-level segment on the special theme of the second session of the United Nations Habitat Assembly with expected participation of Governments, Partners and Stakeholders
The High-level segment should include the presence and participation of Heads of State, and in addition, there is a possibility for the First Lady's roundtable to take place within the days assigned for high level segment but outside of the plenary activities
☐Member States will have the opportunity to deliver National Statements – most likely delivered at the Ministerial level.
It is expected that various partners and stakeholders, notably subnational governments, parliamentarians and non-governmental organizations, will convene their own informal consultations, events and activities prior to and during the session

The Bureau is expected to firm up the detailed organisation of work of the second session of the United Nations Habitat Assembly

EXPECTED PARTICIPATION AT THE SESSION





- 1. Expected high-level representation at the **Ministerial level for the 193 State Members of the United Nations**, and for substantive representation at the session.
- 2. UN-HABITAT also expects participation at highest level of Government as has been in the past.
- 3. The first session of the United Nations Habitat Assembly held in May 2019 was attended by 4000 participants, 60 Ministers and 4 Heads of States.
- ☐ Letters inviting Ministers of Foreign Affairs have been transmitted.
- ☐ Letters inviting line Ministries are being transmitted by 15 February 2023.



UPCOMING KEY TIMELINES IN THE ROADMAP TO THE UN-HABITAT ASSEMBLY



- **February 2023: Invitations** to high level Government officials for the second session of the Assembly, particularly Ministers of Foreign Affairs and line Ministers.
- February 2023: call for submissions of side event proposals and exhibitions 2023.
- **28-29 March 2023 :** First session of the Executive Board for the year 2023 with possible recommendations for the UN-Habitat Assembly.
- **24 April 2023:** Transmission of **pre-session documents** for the UN-Habitat Assembly to all Member States in all languages.
- ○29 May 2 June 2023 : Open-ended meeting of the CPR to prepare for the second session of the UN-Habitat Assembly.
- ○5-9 June 2023: Second session of the UN-Habitat Assembly.



SUBMISSION OF RESOLUTIONS TO THE SECOND SESSION OF THE UN-HABITAT ASSEMBLES



- 1. Submission of draft resolutions for consideration by the UN-Habitat Assembly is the prerogative of Member States.
- 2. A Member State or group of Member States may submit draft resolutions for consideration.
- 3. Draft resolutions may be submitted for consideration by the UN-Habitat Assembly any time before or during the session. Guidance will be given by the Bureau of the UN-Habitat Assembly for consideration by the delegations at the first meeting of the session, on the deadline for submission of resolutions during the session.
- 4. Member States may wish start consultations on draft resolutions, guided by the provisional Agenda of the session.
- 5. Member States may also submit draft resolutions from mid-April 2023 after the pre-session documents, including reports of the Executive Director, have become available. Nothing, however, precludes the submission of resolutions prior to that date.
- 6. The objective of a resolution may be to offer guidance or recommendations to the Executive Director or to Member States or as a decision on a particular matter based upon the provisional Agenda or matters under discussions.

SUBMISSION OF RESOLUTIONS TO THE SECOND SESSION OF THE UN-HABITAT ASSEMBLES



- 7. The Secretariat may offer technical and substantive support to Member States in preparing draff THE NEW resolutions, if requested or as appropriate.
- 8. It is highly encouraged that resolutions be submitted early to allow sufficient time for negotiations and consensus-building including through informal consultations organized by the Chair of the Committee of Permanent Representatives and through formal consultations during the open-ended meeting of the Committee of Permanent Representatives in preparation for the Assembly.
- 9. In this regard, the Bureau of the Assembly working with the Bureau of the CPR may issue guidance on the recommended deadline for submissions of resolutions, which may be first considered first by the CPR, under informal consultations and during the second open ended meeting of the CPR, for onward transmission to the Assembly.
- 10. Draft resolutions that are formally submitted will be considered by the UN-Habitat Assembly at its second session.
- 11. Draft resolutions may be addressed to the Chair of the CPR but submitted through the Secretary of the Governing Bodies at chris.mensah@un.org with a copy to unhabitat-sgb@un.org

NEXT STEP: update the guidelines to include any recommendations the Bureau may have.



UN-HABITAT ASSEMBLY TASK FORCE





Terms of Reference

The organization-wide task force on the preparations for the second session of the UN-Habitat performs the following tasks.

- 1. Identifying expected outcomes and proposing innovative approaches to obtain them.
- 2. In-house and external resource mobilization for the organization of the Assembly.
- 3. Recommending high-level political representation at the Assembly.
- 4. Advising on the format of the components of the Assembly, such as the plenary, including dialogue on the theme, the sessional committee, and the opening and closing ceremonies.
- 5. Identifying which substantive documents are required.
- 6. Considering how UN-Habitat can best support the Committee of Permanent Representatives and the Executive Board as they prepare for the Assembly.
- 7. Advising on external and internal communications; and
- 8. Any other tasks as assigned by the Executive Director and Acting Deputy Executive Director.

Three sub-groups have been proposed as follows:

Subgroup 1: high-level participation and protocol. Key Tasks:

- 1. High-level attendance.
- 2. regional mobilization for high-level participation.

Subgroup 2: Substantive coordination, including support on dialogue and provision of technical language for draft resolutions. Key Tasks:

- 1. Reviewing the format and shaping the dialogue on the theme.
- 2. Support preparation of draft technical inputs for draft resolutions and decisions to be considered by the UN-Habitat Assembly, in relation to the theme.
- 3. Preparation of ED's statements.
- 4. Clearance of reports.
- 5. Quality control.
- 6. Editing the daily journal.

a)Proposed ideas for process / management resolutions

- 11. Decision on the next session of the UN-Habitat Assembly aligned with the QCPR and the next Strategic Plan.
- 12. Decision on the stakeholder engagement policy.
- 13. Resolutions related to the report of the JIU on administrative and management review of UN-Habitat, especially as related to governance.
- 14. Election of 36 new Members of the Executive Board.
- 15. Election of a new President and Bureau of the UN-Habitat Assembly.
- 16. Financing and monitoring mechanism for resolutions.



ISSUES FOR GUIDANCE BY THE BUREAU





- 1. Format of the session: The Bureau may consider either
 - i. Hybrid, or
 - ii. fully in-person participation.
- 2. Timelines for submitting draft resolutions: It is proposed that:
 - i. Resolutions be submitted to the secretariat as soon as possible from now onwards until 30 April 2023 for consideration by the OECPR.
 - ii. Final submissions of draft resolutions for consideration by the second session of the UN-Habitat Assembly should be by the end of Day two of the session on 6 June 2023.
- 3. Consideration for a CPR subcommittee during the second open OECPR iii. The CPR may consider formal creating a subcommittee as provided for in rule 23 of the rules of procedure to assist with its preparatory work.

ISSUES FOR GUIDANCE BY THE BUREAU





4. Preliminary Organization of work <u>prior to</u> the second session of the UN-Habitat Assembly:

- i. Informal consultations on preparations for the Assembly and the OECPR should take place at least once a month as proposed, and where possible for a full day, under the leadership of the Chair of the CPR.
- ii. The Bureau of the Assembly (which includes the CPR Bureau) will convene regularly as proposed to prepare for the Assembly.

5. Preliminary Organization of work <u>during</u> the session:

- i. The High-level opening should be on Day 1, 5 June 2023 and the High-Level segment of the Assembly should be designated as Day 1: 5 June 2023 and Day 2:, 6 June 2023.
- ii. Most work of the Assembly should be held in the Plenary and as appropriate, through the Committee of the Whole.
- iii. A Drafting Committee will work to conclude any negotiations on the draft resolutions prior to consideration by the plenary.
- iv. Non-legislative activities including special events, side events, regional groups meetings will be held outside the official timings of the session each day.
