SUMMARY

As the majority of world's population lives in urban agglomerations, the roles, responsibilities, vulnerabilities, challenges, opportunities and potentials of local and other subnational governments in addressing global challenges become more visible, acute and urgent. Coinciding with the World Environment Day, the side event will highlight how urbanization and multilevel action have been gaining attraction, recognition and engagement in decision making and implementation agendas of global intergovernmental processes under the United Nations addressing climate, nature, pollution emergencies along with the Sustainable Development Goals, as well as at non-UN processes such as U7 as an engagement group of the G7 or U20 as an engagement group of the G20. The event will receive inputs from local leaders as well as experts from UN institutions and global networks, followed by reflections from national governments presiding the leadership of respective processes in recent years.
