The event titled "Promoting people centered smart cities for inclusive and sustainable futures leveraging global digital cooperation", co-organised by the Government of the Republic of France and UN-Habitat, to be held on 5 June 2023 from 13:15 - 14:15 (EAT Time), aims to discuss and explore global and field experiences in adopting smart city approaches for sustainable and inclusive urbanization.

Through practical case studies, the debate will showcase how a people centered smart city approach can advance common guiding principles and multilateral cooperation, especially in times of global crises and digital divide, hence accelerating SDGs achievement and the implementation of the New Urban Agenda through inclusive and sustainable urbanization.

The event will outline opportunities for ensuring sustainable futures across urban and rural areas through technology, stressing the importance of inclusivity, collaboration and multilateral cooperation among different countries and communities "to leave no one and no place behind". 
