



Snapshot on our Innovative Approaches towards Sustainable Cities in Africa

Highlight of UN-Habitat's work in Africa

Main impacts:

- Construction of 200 permanent houses including the social amenities in Baidoa through a community driven approach.
- Construction of a Baidoa Youth Hub •
- Construction of a fully equipped **soccer field** ٠ in Kismayo; improved access to public spaces by youth.
- Over 550 youth were trained in peace ٠ building and livelihood opportunities
- Improved security of land tenure for 200 IDP • house holds
- In addition to new construction, several • rehabilitation works were also carried out including the rehabilitation of 100 shelters, a soccer field, and two schools which has improved the quality and access of these services by the community.

 The project, with its integrated and area-based interventions, advanced the links between humanitarian, development, and peace in Burkina Faso.

- The project increased access to housing for 2,000 IDP Families in vulnerable situations;
- The project strengthened **social** cohesion between local and displaced communities.
- In Addition. classrooms were built to allow better learning environment for children and teachers.

• The project, focused at **conflict** prevention and peacebuilding through community-driven actions,

- Over 4.000 households benefitted from complementary activities;- construction of houses, improvement of community infrastructure (water, sanitation, road, multipurpose centers), community development support, livelihood assistance, and peace and development initiatives
- The project donated **5 tricycles** and **06** brickmaker machines to strengthen the capacities of 05 participating municipalities to support efforts made in improving the living conditions of IDPs and host communities. This with an aim to collectively target a broader range of stakeholders

Building On Best Practices in Mozambique

Sustainable and gender sensitive integration of IDPs in Pemba through the implementation of Urban Durable Solutions.

- In Pemba City we are addressing the complex challenges presented by mass displacement and transforming the crisis into an opportunity for sustainable, inclusive urban development through strengthen the resilience of IDPs and host communities, especially women and girls
- 52.000 people benefitting from increased access to basic services 50% of women engaging in the participatory planning 400 women supported in income generating activities 2 public services and 6 community infrastructure targeted with rehabilitation, extension or new construction


