





# Inaugural World Cleanup Day: Information Note

Date: Friday 20 September

**Time:** 08:30 - 16:30

Location: Fram Centre, Tromsø

### Welcome to the Arctic!

## Tromsø, Norway:

**Weather:** In September, the weather in Tromsø is typically cool and crisp, with a mix of cloudy/rainy days and occasional sunshine. The average temperature hovers around **8°C**, but it can fluctuate between 4°C and 12°C.

**Time zone:** As of now in September, Norway is on **Central European Summer Time (CEST)**, which is UTC+2.

**Currency:** The local currency is the Norwegian Krone (**NOK**). As of September 12, 2024, the exchange rates for the NOK are approximately:

- 1 NOK = 0.0931 USD
- 1 NOK = 0.0869 EUR
- 1 NOK = 0.0725 GBP
- 1 NOK = 13.51 KES

**Electricity:** Norway uses the standard Euro plug socket with two round prongs so you can use adapter types C or F (often labelled as a Northern Europe adapter).









#### Visa

All participants are personally responsible to obtain an adequate visa. For the most accurate and detailed information, it's best to check with the <u>Norwegian Directorate</u> of <u>Immigration (UDI)</u> or the local Norwegian embassy or consulate.

## **Airport transportation**

To get from Tromsø Airport (Tromsø Lufthavn) to the city center, you may choose between:

## <u>Airport Bus (Flybussen)</u>

The airport bus, called <u>Flybussen</u>, provides regular service between Tromsø Airport and the city center. The journey takes about 15-20 minutes, depending on traffic. The bus operates frequently throughout the day, and tickets can be purchased online, via the Flybussen app, or directly from the driver.

#### Taxi

Taxis are available outside the terminal, and the ride to the city center takes approximately 10-15 minutes, depending on traffic. Expect to pay around 250 NOK, depending on the time of day and traffic conditions.
