Background

Imagine looking back in 10 years and witnessing cities and human settlements worldwide transforming into more resilient, compassionate, and thriving communities. What would it take to get there?

Cities are spearheading the path toward sustainable development and enhanced quality of life. They are uniquely positioned to do so. As actors closest to their populations, cities are best placed to identify and address the issues that matter most to their communities. As hubs of innovation and economic growth, cities can create tailored solutions to pressing challenges, paving the way in creating more equitable and sustainable futures and improving quality of life for all.

However, many challenges lie ahead. Our rapidly urbanizing world demands adequate housing, transportation, energy systems, and other critical infrastructure, as well as employment opportunities and essential services like education and healthcare, all of which must be delivered inclusively in a manner that leaves no one behind. Local governments are increasingly challenged to go beyond numbers and respond to how people experience life in urban areas. Furthermore, cities must tackle the most complex and 'wicked problems' of the 21st century, including how we respond and adapt to a changing climate, natural disasters and pandemics.

With the right data and policies, cities can navigate the complexities of urbanization and environmental challenges, ultimately enhancing the quality of life for all residents. This requires identifying individual priorities from both personal and community perspectives. It necessitates understanding each person's needs holistically within their community context. It is also paramount to establish a critical connection between data production and analysis, knowledge and to policy in order to produce actionable responses to improve quality of life in different urban settings.





The Quality of Life Initiative presents a path forward: it tells the story of the people making the change, the cities and communities pioneering into the future, and provides a guide to help us get there. Implemented by the United Nations Human Settlements Programme (UN-Habitat), the Quality of Life Initiative—a global initiative supported by a coalition of countries and sponsored by the Quality of Life Program Centre of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia—aims to empower pioneering cities' equitable and sustainable futures and improving quality of life for all.

The Initiative goes beyond typical data tools, aiming to be globally relevant yet locally applicable. It captures universal aspects of quality of life while considering local factors, values, and priorities that define quality of life in different contexts.

As part of its bold vision for the future, where quality of life for people and the planet takes center stage, with individuals and communities driving their own progress, the Quality of Life Initiative will convene a two-day conference in Cairo, Egypt as part of the Twelfth Session of the World Urban Forum. It marks the culmination of two years of efforts to advance thinking on quality of life, develop related metrics, and explore their global applicability in various local contexts.

The conference will serve as a global platform to debate, exchange views, learn, and act on quality of life. The concept of quality of life varies for each individual and has been significantly influenced by recent interconnected challenges such as environmental degradation, climate change, pandemics, inequalities, and rapid technological shifts. Consequently, the concept of a 'good life,' philosophically foundational to quality of life as defined by Aristotle, has undergone substantial evolution for both people and the planet, reshaping how policies are crafted, understood, and implemented. By addressing these issues head-on, we can forge a path toward a sustainable and equitable future.
