Japan is aware that the next strategic plan will focus on housing, land, and basic services, and then that the importance of spatial planning will be highlighted as a means of implementation.

From Asia and Pacific, Cambodia, Laos, and Nepal attended the last SPP meeting. Participants shared their challenges and their future visions.

Moreover, they shared the importance of data collection and analysis, and then they recognized the value of digital technologies.

The next strategic plan has been steadily discussed for the formulation. When the next strategic plan is formulated, Japan believes that SPP platform could contribute to the creation of spatial planning for more countries and regions.

Lastly, Japan's infrastructure ministry welcomes more countries and regions to join this SPP platform and benefit from this platform.
