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

UN-Habitat's funding structure




Size and proportion of funding types (1 Jan 2020 – 30 Jun 2025)



Foundation non-earmarked funding

What is it?

- Part of core resources
- Provide resources for (a) core normative programmatic activities, (b) policymaking organs, (c) executive direction and management.
- 2025 budget USD 4.687 Million, may be increased to USD 5.944 million (with conditions)
- 3% of total revenue in the period of 2020-2025, disproportional to the large project portfolio
- Goal: Adequate and predictable core funding and enlarged donor base

- Review and approve work programme and budget
- Advise on actions to help mainstream core funding into Government budgets
- Send core contribution letters and advocate for support from capital
- Support and take part in strategic funding dialogues bilateral and joint consultations
- Take part in partnership and pledging events to increase core support

Foundation earmarked funding

What

- Finances earmarked global programmes and key normative work e.g. World Urban Forum, SDG Localization, Global Land Tool Network, etc.
- Around 25% of total revenue in the period of 2020-2025
- Goals: quality contribution (flexibility and predictability) aligned with the priorities of the Strategic Plan

- Review and approve work programme and budget
- Share development aid strategy, priority/interest areas and needs of your country
- Advocate for support for programmes that are key to the delivery of UN-Habitat's mandates
- Advocate for soft earmarked and multi-year support

Technical cooperation funding

What

- Finances earmarked regional and country programmes
- Operational projects on the ground, incl. integrating the normative work
- Largest share of UN-Habitat's funding (56%) in the period of 2020-2025
- Fluctuate over years (demand-driven and affected by donor priorities)

- Review and approve work programme and budget
- Share development aid strategy for your country
- Support for strengthening regional architecture and country presence
- Take part in strategic Regional Dialogues
- Support strategic dialogues with focal Ministries in your country



Programme Support Costs (PSC)


What

- Covers indirect costs related to earmarked projects e.g. administrative, budget and finance, human resources, procurement services and support, etc.
- Represent 7% of total revenue in the period of 2020-2025
- Has been relatively stable, largely determined by project expenditure


- Member States requested to comply with UN Secretariat cost recovery policies
- Ensure that core funds do not subsidize earmarked projects in line General Assembly Resolution A/RES/67/226 which requested implementation of full cost recovery

- ✓ Grounded in on extensive internal consultations
- ✓ Informed by lessons learnt from 2020-2025
- ✓ Will be shared with MS as a background document prior to EB in November 2025

Key principles of UN-Habitat's Resource Mobilization Strategy 2026-2029

Maintain and grow core (expand donor base) Domestic resources to strengthen permanent representation (country offices) on the ground Align development needs and donor priorities for project portfolio Seize new opportunities, e.g. subnational governments, middleincome countries/emerging economies Leverage existing and innovative funding mechanisms, e.g. IFIs, vertical funds, UN pooled funds and private sector
