Title: C40 and UN-Habitat launch the Urban Planning Accelerator for Climate Responsive Cities

Rio de Janeiro, Brazil (4 November 2025)

C40 Cities and UN-Habitat have launched the Urban Planning Accelerator, a new joint initiative to help cities around the world transition to a climate-responsive urban planning model by 2035.

Through this joint initiative, C40 and UN-Habitat will provide technical, policy, and political support to participating cities to ensure that climate considerations become a central element of urban growth and development. Through tailored assistance, peer learning, and knowledge exchange, the Accelerator will help local governments reform planning frameworks, strengthen urban resilience, and align city master plans with global climate goals.

The Urban Planning Accelerator responds to the growing urban and climate challenges that cities around the world are facing: In many areas, urban expansion is outpacing population growth, green spaces are disappearing, and housing is increasingly impacted by climate-related hazards.

Cities joining the Urban Planning Accelerator commit to a climate-responsive urban planning model by incorporating the following objectives into the city's master plan and/or other relevant land-use plans:

- **Compact**: Prioritise regeneration and densification over urban sprawl.
- **Polycentric**: Adopt a polycentric model and foster mixed-use neighbourhoods.
- **Connected**: Steer new development near transit hubs to encourage residents to adopt sustainable mobility patterns.
- **Risk-Informed**: Restrict new development in areas of high climate risk.
- **Nature-Positive**: Secure and protect land for nature to shield against extreme weather events.

- **Inclusive**: Mandate adequate and affordable housing to improve resilience for the most vulnerable.

The initiative supports UN-Habitat's strategy to advance environment and climate action through sustainable housing, land use, and basic urban services, helping cities plan and grow in ways that strengthen resilience and improve living conditions for all.

C40 and UN-Habitat will work closely with signatory cities, fostering city-to-city knowledge exchange, documenting best practices, and monitoring progress toward the Accelerator's targets through consistent follow-up and reporting.
