




Baku Olympic Stadium, Baku, Azerbaijan, 17–22 May 2026





Baku, Azerbaijan, will host the thirteenth session of the World Urban Forum (WUF13) from 17 to 22 May 2026, under the theme “Housing the world: Safe and resilient cities and communities.”

The Forum will explore solutions to transform informal settlements and slums and address the global housing crisis.

Established in 2001, the World Urban Forum is the United Nations' premier global conference on cities and sustainable urbanization.

Co-organized by UN-Habitat and the Government of Azerbaijan, this is the first time WUF is being held in the Caucasus region.

WUF13 will gather ministers, regional governors, mayors, urban planners, policymakers, the private sector, community leaders, civil society, academics and UN agencies to share their knowledge and collaborate on sustainable urban development.



Anacláudia Rossbach

Under-Secretary-General and Executive Director of UN-Habitat

Anacláudia Rossbach is an economist with more than 20 years of experience in housing, informal settlements and urban policies. She was appointed Executive Director of UN-Habitat in June 2024. Prior to her appointment, she oversaw the development and implementation of Brazilian housing and slum-upgrading policies at the World Bank and was Director for Latin America and the Caribbean at the Lincoln Institute of Land Policy.



Anar Gulyiyev

Chairman, State Committee on Urban Planning and Architecture, and National WUF13 Coordinator

Anar Gulyiyev began his career at the State Committee on Property of the Republic of Azerbaijan, followed by senior positions at the Ministry of Economic Development and the Azerbaijan Investment and Export Promotion Foundation. From 2009 to 2016, Gulyiyev served as Chief of Department at the “Icherisheher” State Historical-Architectural Reserve under the Cabinet of Ministers. From 2016 to 2018, Gulyiyev held the position of Chief of Staff and Advisor to the Director at the State Housing Development Agency.

WUF13 Dialogues are key events shaping policy and action

Dialogue 1:

The Global Housing Crisis: What is the Plan?

How are governments, the private sector and non-profits addressing severe problems of affordability that are a prominent factor in cities worldwide?

Dialogue 2:

Transforming Informal Settlements and Slums

Explores how these urban areas can be transformed without penalizing informal housing and how higher quality services and infrastructure can be offered to residents.

Dialogue 3:

Housing at the Centre of Crisis Recovery and Reconstruction

How we can redefine reconstruction after crisis to prioritize adequate housing, and how can cities embed the issues created by displacement into their planning and housing policies?

Dialogue 4:

The Climate-Housing Nexus

Examines ways of ensuring that climate-resilient housing policies don't lead to forced evictions and gentrification, and how new housing initiatives can focus on people as well as decarbonization.

Dialogue 5:

The Social and Economic Power of Housing

How to reconcile the dual role of housing as a driver of economic development and provider of adequate shelter, and the role of local government in promoting the economic role of housing.

Dialogue 6:

A New Deal for Housing Finance

Alternatives to conventional housing finance have emerged but remain underrecognized. What would a new deal in housing finance that is inclusive, sustainable, and responsive to diverse needs look like?




Innovations at WUF13

Another novelty, the **WUF Academy**, invites universities, training institutes and partner organizations to host learning sessions designed to build skills and capacities to address urban challenges.



Media Hub
