Draft decision 2026/[B]: Implementation of the normative and operational activities of UN-Habitat

The Executive Board

(a) Implementation of the normative and operational activities of UN-Habitat

1. *Welcomes* the briefing and the report by the Executive Director on normative and operational activities of UN-Habitat⁸, including the updates on the Brazil country programme, the Tunisia country programme, the work of the United Nations Innovation Technology Accelerator for Cities (UNITAC) and highlights of activities for the period July-December 2025; **Agreed ad ref**

2. *Takes note of* the revised and updated report⁹ by the Executive Director on the status of the development of the efforts to reconstruct the human settlements in Ukraine, and requests the Executive Director to provide an update in the next session of the Executive Board on the funding status to sustain UN-Habitat presence in Ukraine thereafter April 2026; **Agreed ad ref**

3. *Takes note of* the report by the Executive Director on the status of the development of the efforts to reconstruct the human settlements in the Gaza Strip¹⁰, and requests the Executive Director to complete the comprehensive report once conditions permit; **Agreed ad ref**

(b) Preparations for the thirteenth session of the World Urban Forum

[4. *Welcomes* the briefing and the report of the Executive Director on the status of preparations for the thirteenth session of the World Urban Forum, to be held in Baku, Azerbaijan in May 2026[, recalling the role of the World Urban Forum as the world's premier conference on cities and sustainable urbanization (A/RES/73/307) and as an advocacy platform for all stakeholders (A/RES/79/214) to inform the Quadrennial Reporting of the UN General Assembly on the New Urban Agenda (A/RES/71/256). **Agreed ad ref**

5. *Acknowledges* efforts undertaken to engage stakeholders in the preparations for the World Urban Forum. **Agreed ad ref**

(c) Preparations for the high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the midterm review of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda

6. *Welcomes* efforts by UN-Habitat to support the development of the Quadrennial Report of the Secretary-General on the Implementation of the New Urban Agenda through an inclusive multi-stakeholder process and the information provided related to the preparations for the high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the midterm review of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda. **Agreed ad ref**

7. *Welcomes* the ongoing intergovernmental preparations for the high-level meeting of the General Assembly on the midterm review of the implementation of the New Urban Agenda, including the appointment of co-facilitators by the President of the General Assembly, through an inclusive and

(b) Work of the Open-ended Intergovernmental Expert Working Group on Adequate Housing for All

3. *Recalls* resolution 2/7 of the UN-Habitat Assembly, and welcomes the briefing by the Co-Chairs of the Open-ended Intergovernmental Expert Working Group on Adequate Housing for All on the Group's work including the report of the outcome of the second session, held on 22 and 23 October 2025; **Agreed ad ref**

4. *Decides* that the third session of the Open-Ended Intergovernmental Expert Working Group on Adequate Housing for All, in line with the guidance by the Bureau of the Executive Board, will be held for a duration of two days on 26 and 27 November 2026, and *invites* Member States to consider providing financial resources to support the overall inclusive work and effective functioning of the Working Group, including by facilitating the participation of representatives from developing countries; **agreed ad ref**

5. *Recommends* that the provisional agenda for the third session be prepared by the Co-Chairs of the Open-ended Intergovernmental Expert Working Group on Adequate Housing for All and shared with all Member States at least six weeks in advance of the meeting. **Agreed ad ref**
